

Remarks on the Board Schooner a E Whyland  
 March the 16 the 1915- we Sail from New Bedford Mass  
 For whaling Voyage on North of South Atlantic  
 Ocean. with 15<sup>th</sup> man on board. at 12 20 the tow boat  
 Leave and wind from S.W. all sail set at 6 p.m.  
 Set the watch put on the cables below  
 Fine breeze and clear weather no observed  
 From New Bedford we bound to St Eustatius west-indian  
 Ships rest the crew the pump and light attended  
 end of the day

March wednesday the 17

Strong breeze from East-wind and high  
 Sea taking on light sails and mainsail  
 Set the try sail two steams sight one bound  
 west one bound East pump and light carefull  
 attended no observed end of the day

March Thursday the 18

Strong breeze from north wind and high sea  
 cloudy weather the ship under the try sail  
 Pump and light carefull attended  
 no observed end the day

March the 19 Friday

Fresh breeze from NE wind and squally weather  
 ship under lead sail and foresail and  
 main try sail pump and light carefull attended  
 lat by D. R. 35° 40' long 66° 25' W end the day

March 20 Saturday

Strong breeze high wind from S.W.  
 cloudy weather the ship under main  
 try sail foresail and pump and light carefull  
 lat 35° 15' long 68°  
 end of the day
