Tuesday July 16th
At 9 A.M. we got under weigh at Clark's point with
a pilot on board and commenced to work out of the bay with
a light breeze from S.W. And so ends this day

Wednesday July 17th
This day commences in the light breeze from S.W. and
clear at 4 P.M. clear the land, and discharged our pilot and
stood to S.E. by the wind, the middle and latter part light
breeze from W.S. The ship heading from N.E. by E. toward
the anchor and chains and commenced fitting the boats, found
a Man standing by in the hole, he gave his name as Mingo Silva
A native of St. Catharines, And so ends this day

Thursday July 18th
Lat 39 42 N Long 70 50 W Fine weather all this day
with light air from S.W. The first part the ship practice to
S.E. by the wind the middle part calm the latter part light
air from N.E. hours S.W. by S. set the royal yards down and
sent up hoops and made the mast heads, the watch employed
in fitting cutting gear and boats, one sail in sight And so
ends this day

Friday July 19th
Lat 38 46 N Long 69 40 W Fine weather all this
day with light breeze from N.E. hours S.W. by S. All day all
drawing sails out the watch employed in fitting boats and
cutting gear, and grampus, And so ends this day

Saturday July 20th
No Ober. Rainy the first part with a light breeze from
N.E. hours S.W. by S. sail out the middle part squally
with rain and a fresh breeze from N. course by W. double reefed
the fore top sail the latter part fine weather with light air
from N.E. by W. hours S.W. by S. sail out. The watch employed
in ships duty and so ends this day Two sails in sight
