

Galapagos Islands.

Thursday July 26th 1855.

Strong breezes from the Southward, and fine weather heading to the E. Saw 2 sails standing to the W. at night took in the light sails.

Friday July 27th 1855.

Strong breezes from the S.E. and cloudy. at 7 A.M. were ships to the W.ward. Saw 2 sails and a ship standing to the E.ward.
 Lat 1 - 50 S.
 Long 85 - 2 W.

Saturday July 28th 1855.

Strong winds from the S.E. and cloudy. the ship heading to the Eward. at 7 spoke the ship *Charlenger* of Westport. Capt. Cornell. He came out with 500 lbs of. 200 lbs. Kumpack. Capt. C. came on board and passed the evening at 10 returned on board his ship.

Sunday July 29th 1855.

Strong winds and cloudy heading to the Westward. latter part more ship to the E. saw the *Charlenger* also saw 2 sails. at night double-reefed the fore and maintopsails.

Monday July 30th 1855.

Light winds and fine weather, the ship heading to the E. under double-reefed topsails. the men employed in cooping oil.
 Lat 2 - 30 S.
 Long 82 - 8 W.

Tuesday July 31st 1855.

Light winds from the S.E. and cloudy, heading to the E. under double-reefed topsails, employed in stowing down oil. at night finished having stowed down 40 lbs.

Galapagos Islands.

Wednesday August 1st 1855.

Light winds and fine weather. the ship heading to the E. the men employed in breaking out the coffee hold and cooping flour & meat. saw *Thompson* and *Porpoise*. (I have been busy cooping.)

Lat 2 - 12 S.
 Long 87 - 52 W.

Thursday August 2nd 1855.

Light winds and fine weather. the ship heading to the Eward. the men still employed in cooping meat. saw 2 sails.
 Lat 1 - 40 S.
 Long 87 - 37 W.

Friday August 3rd 1855.

Light winds and fine weather. the ship heading to the Eward. the men employed in breaking out and cooping bread. saw 2 sails. at night spoke ship to the S.W. (I have been working)
 Lat 1 - 25 S.
 Long 87 - 16 W.

Saturday August 4th 1855.

Moderate winds and squally. the men washing ship. saw *Porpoise*.
 Lat 1 - 45 S.
 Long 88 - 52 W.

Sunday August 5th 1855.

Moderate winds from the Eward, and squally. steering W. by N. saw 2 sails and *Porpoise*. at night took in the light sails and hauled to the wind. heading to the E. mainyard aback.
 Lat 2 - 30 S.
 Long 89 - 57 W.

Monday August 6th 1855.

Moderate winds and squally. later part clear. saw 2 sails and spoke the *Bark Domingo* of St. Seofora. Capt. Phinney. 11 men 180 lbs of. Capt. P. came on board and passed the evening. at 10 left for his ship. (again disappointed in not getting letters) at night *Albatross* bearing at W. saw one *Blackfish*.
