Monday July 24 This day very strong SW wind and clear weather vessel under two try sails and jib on Port tack heading SSE at 10 AM we spoke to "A. E. Whyland" and we exchange the officer Charles Brown, transferred to Schooner "A. E. Whyland" for master, and we take the Joseph Rodrigues, for second mate, with 23 day 1/2 at 6 PM we wore ship to westward pump attended to "Bertha" in sight

Tuesday July 25 This day moderate wind from NE and clear weather great swell from SW vessel under two try sails and jib on Starboard tack heading NE two schooner in sight and two merchant men bound to North

Wednesday July 26 This day light NE wind with clear weather vessel under all sails set cruising - saw lots of porpoises Whyland in sight at sun set we shorting sails pump attended to

Thursday July 27 This day fresh Easterly wind and clear atmosphere vessel under shorting sails standing on windward on Port tack - "Bertha" in sight pump attended to

Friday July 28 This day light NE wind and clear atmosphere later part squally with great swell from West vessel under main try sails fore sails and head sails standing on Windward on Starboard tack Park and 3 Schooner in sight pump attended to

Saturday July 29 This day dead calm with clear atmosphere vessel under no sails set two Schooners and Park in sight to the leeward, saw a porpoise pump attended to
