

Sch. "Carleton Bell" of New Bedford

Monday March 22 "Schooner Carleton Bell" sail from New Bedford for a whaling voyage under command of Joseph C. Bellina her former master, with 10 person composed of crew, vessel in good order and staunch well fitted for the voyage drawing 11 feet deeper and 7' forward at 10 A.M. we start from Wharf in tow of tug boat "E. S. Cherman" at 12.30 the tug hauls us and we made all sails on Starboard tack head South Wind from SW and clear atmosphere at 6 P.M. No mainland bore ENE about 10 miles off which I took my departure, at 7 P.M. we set watch Starboard took first watch on deck - pumps attended to

Tuesday March 23 This day moderate wind from NW and clear atmosphere vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack steer South low two "Setamers" found West at 4 P.M. we unbend the cable and put them below. pumps attended to

Lat 40.10 N Long 70.49 W

Wednesday March 24 This day strong breezes from the NW and clear weather vessel under all sails set on Starboard tack steer S by E at 5 P.M. Wind blown more we take in main sails set main topsail pumps attended to

Lat 37.47 N Long 69.36 W
