

Bark Active of New Bedford Capt Wm Wood

Monday June 2^d 1856
Latter part calm and foggy at 4.15 A.M. Steamer Spray hooked on to us and left Capt Wood ashore came to off middle ledge Capt Wood came aboard got our anchor and was towed a short distance a thick fog at 10 E. Anchored and steamer went up latter part heavy fog see nothing so ends this 24 hours all hands employed in fitting boats off

Middle Ledge

Tuesday June 3^d
Commences with a thick heavy fog all hands employed in fitting boats &c at 5. P.M. Capt Wood went on shore in a yacht at 6. P.M. sighted our anchor furlled all the sails &c &c at 8. P.M. sat the watch myself 2^d & 3^d officers standing the watches middle part cleared some at daylight got under weigh at 12. No was of the light boat waiting for the Capt so ends this 24 hours off the Light Boat

Wednesday June 4th
Commences with fresh breeze from W.S.W. at 12. P.M. Capt Wood came on board and steered by the wind to the S.S.E. under whole topsails course jib spanker gaff topsails & maintopgallant sail at 6. P.M. chose the watches at 4. P.M. sat watch middle part squally with thunder & lightning took in part to reef top sail & foresail at daylight set sail again lower S.E. latter part moderate & pleasant watch employed in coiling fitting boats &c. Lat 40.04 N Long 69.57 W
