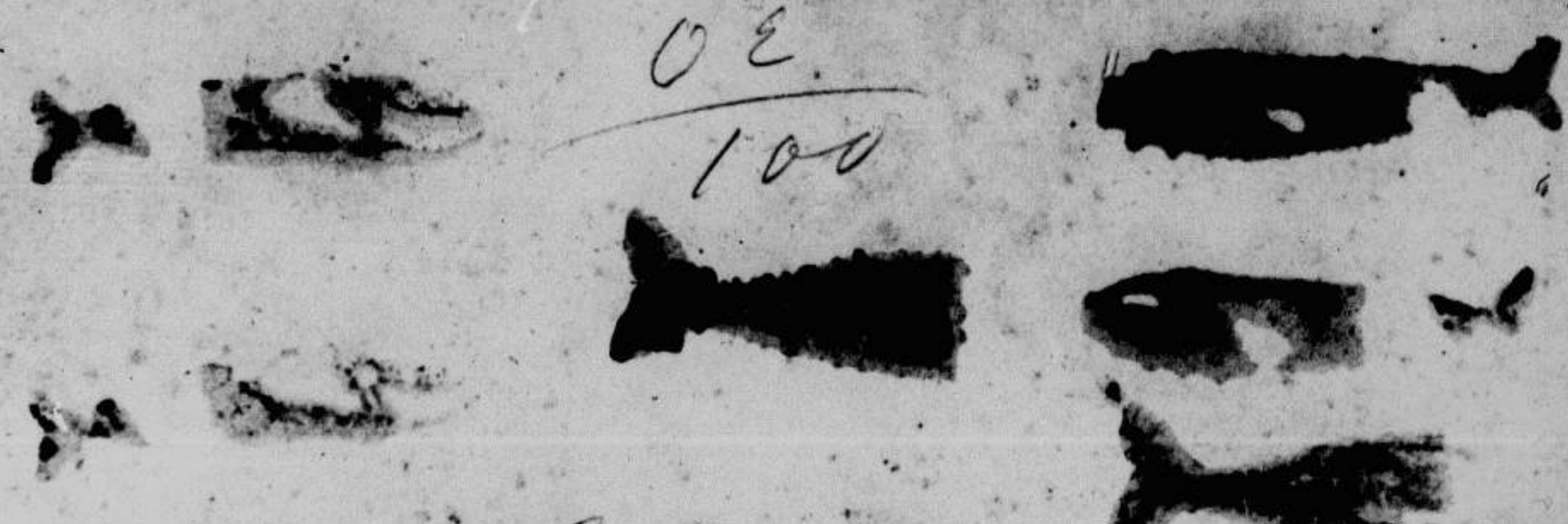


Arrivals & Departures

Arrived at Hilo October 20<sup>th</sup> 1864 Sailed October 24<sup>th</sup>  
 at Honolulu = 28<sup>th</sup> Sailed November 24<sup>th</sup> Arrived at  
 San Quinton December 16<sup>th</sup> Sailed Dec 21<sup>st</sup> Jan 14<sup>th</sup> 1865  
 Arrived 25<sup>th</sup> Arrived at Point Barrow Dec 27<sup>th</sup> January 14<sup>th</sup> 1865  
 by the Point for the Berar. Left the Point the second time  
 January 26<sup>th</sup> Cape St Lucas Jan 26<sup>th</sup> Storm Whaler Feb 9<sup>th</sup>  
 Sat on 32 South Long 113.22 Arrived at Hilo March 21<sup>st</sup> 1865  
 April 6<sup>th</sup> Sailed April 11<sup>th</sup> Sailed April 21<sup>st</sup> Arrived at Honolulu  
 April 29 Sailed April 30<sup>th</sup> Sailed April 26<sup>th</sup> Arrived 27<sup>th</sup> Sailed 28<sup>th</sup> for  
 the Arctic. Saw Behring Island May 19<sup>th</sup> Saw the first ice  
 May 23<sup>rd</sup> Saw the land Cape May 25<sup>th</sup>  
 "Heard of the Alaskanian June 25<sup>th</sup> near South June 26<sup>th</sup> Behring  
 Strait Kings Island July 20<sup>th</sup> Took our first whale in the Arctic  
 Anadia June 4<sup>th</sup> first one in the Arctic (St. Paul) July 28<sup>th</sup> last one  
 St. Paul 18<sup>th</sup> of St. Paul the last time September 22<sup>nd</sup> Behring Strait  
 Sept 24<sup>th</sup> St. Paul October 11<sup>th</sup> came through the 179 passage Oct 15<sup>th</sup>

 On board ship Ser Trust Capt. Able  
 which sailed from <sup>the Pacific</sup> ~~the Pacific~~ December 2<sup>nd</sup> 1862  
 for the North Pacific Ocean on a whaling voyage.  
 The Ser Trust was 430 tons burden. Linnock built, said  
 to be one of the best ships in the whaling service. I like her  
 very well, but think she is the wettest ship at times that I  
 was ever in (on account of being loaded so much by the head).  
 All beyond page 46 is kept civil time as it is so much  
 more convenient.
