Ship Charles Drew Captain Coffin Sept 1<sup>st</sup> 1794

On Tuesday rode two or three inches when the wind being about south west beating out of New Bedford Harbor the land bearing north east the Ship <sup>steered</sup> East by the wind. Wind vealt.

Wednesday Sept 2<sup>nd</sup>

All hands employed in putting boats and other Ship duty. The Ship Scotland about sun down bound from Haver to New N. York. with 450 Passengers on board short of provisions supplied her with Bread coffee and sugar wind about S. W.

So ends this last 24 hours

Thursday Sept 3<sup>rd</sup>

Still remained putting boats in the afternoon saw a school of Cows and Black fish wind still remained from the southward and westward. afternoon some of the Ships company were busy breaking out the run.

So ends this last 24 hours

Friday Sept 4<sup>th</sup>

Finished getting crafts ready for the boats. In the afternoon broke out the fore hole and water out of the main hatch, wind about North.

So ends this 24 hours

Saturday Sept 5<sup>th</sup>

All hands employed on Ships duty. In the afternoon at 6 o'clock sent down the fore and main royal masts and the yards wind about North East.

So ends this 24 hours

Sunday Sept 6<sup>th</sup>

All hands employed in reading Books Pamphlets and papers about 11 o'clock A.M. raised a school of Grampuses going to the windward very quick and about North East. So ends this last 24 hours.
