

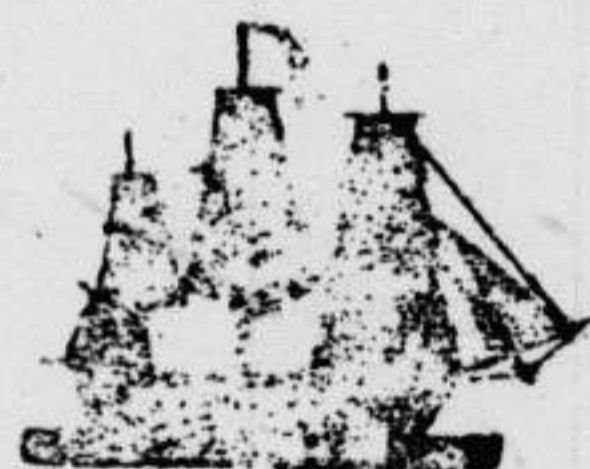
Ship Charles Dren bound to the N. Islands

Remarks on board Tue. Sept 7th 1846

Latter part light breeze S.W. at 8 A.M. took the anchor and stood into the Bay in Co. with Ship heavily at 4th thick fog dropped the anchor at 12 Mer. got under way again

Remarks on board Wed. Sept 8th

First part fine breeze S.W. and pleasant working out the bay at sunset discharged the Pilot Cuttermen's light bearing E 4 miles dist. Mid. foggy by the wind to the S. Latter much the same stood the anchor 4th Lat 40. 37 Long 79 40



Remarks on board Thursday Sept 9th

First part light breeze S.W. and foggy by the wind S.W. all hands employed getting boats & at 5 P.M. fell in with Ship Scotland from Haver for N York. 250 passengers on board & short of provisions supplied him with Bread Coffee & sugar

Mid. wind about the same & foggy by the wind S.W.

Latter part much the same all hands getting boats & other necessary Shipt duty see 2nd vol

Lat 40 16 Long 69 43

Remarks on board Friday Sept 10th

Contd. with a light breeze S.W. & fine weather saw 2 Sail bound to the E.

Mid. wind & weather about the same

Latter part the same all sail out steering S.W. saw a schooner

Lat Long 67 16

Sent down four + Mizen Royal
yes + mast
