Thursday Jan the 17th Jan 1850
Begins with light winds from E by S
ship steering N by E middle part the same
Latter part steering E S E thus ends these
24 hours

Lat 25 " 40

Friday the 18th
Begins with light winds from the
Eastward saw sperm whales the vessel
Boat killed 2 & took them to the ship
Latter part cut them in

Lat 26 " 16 S
Long 27 " 20 W

Saturday Jan the 19th
Begins with light winds saw breaches
supposed them to be sperm whales
Latter part ship steering S W Lat 27 " 21
Long 28 " 39
Lat 28 " 39
Long 22 " 25

Sunday the 20th
Begins with light winds from S E ship
steering S W middle & latter parts the same
Lat above

Monday Jan the 21st
Begins with light winds from E S E
ships course S W by W middle & latter
parts the same thus ends these 24 hours

Begins with light winds from the Eastward
ships course S W by W middle & latter parts the same
Lat 31 " 39

Wednesday Jan the 23rd
Begins with fresh gales from the Northward
no obs

Thursday Jan the 24th
Begins with strong winds from the
Northward ship course S W by W
middle & latter parts a gale from the S W
Lat 34 " 47

Friday Jan the 25th
Begins with fresh gales from the S W
middle & latter parts light winds from the S
Lat 34 " 40
Long 37 " 24

Saturday Jan the 26th
Begins with light winds from the
Northward middle part much the same
Latter part fresh breezes from the N W
ships course S W by W Lat 35 " 56
Long 39 " 05

Saturday Jan the 27th
Begins with fresh breezes from the N W
middle part light winds from the S W latter part
light winds from S S E spoke the Barque engine
of Stonington Brown 29 months out with 2500 lbs
of oil 90 sp
Lat 36 " 45
Long 40 " 23
