

Ship Charles Phelps of Stonington Outward Bound

Tuesday
June the 25
Commences with a light breeze from S^W at 8 o'clock the pilot
came on board we hove up and stood out through watch hills
reef at 10 o'clock we struck on the reef her keel and tore off her
shoering but think she did not touch her bottom at 11 am got her
and went to sea with a fine breeze all hands employed in stowing
the anchors and chains at sun down a fresh breeze from S^W steering
S^E took in our top gallant sails Block Island bearing N^W 20. ends

Wednesday
June the 26
Commences with a fine breeze from the westward steering E^SE
at 8 o'clock set the top gallant sails all hands employed in
fitting boat coiling lines &c latter part much the same
steering E by S saw a number of small vessels so ends
Obs Lat 40.18 Long 69.18 W

Thursday
June the 27
Commences with a light breeze and pleasant weather wind from
the S^W steering E by S at 10 o'clock the large ship passed us
bound to the Eastward carrying a press of sail latter part a fine
breeze from W steering E by S all hands employed in fitting boats lashing
spars breaking out the fore hatchway &c so ends three 24 hours
Obs Lat 40.01 S Long 67.22 W

Friday
June the 28
Commences with a fresh breeze from S^W steering E by S all sail
set one watch employed in Ships duty middle
and latter part pleasant weather a fresh breeze from S^W
Obs Lat 40.33 Long 61.30 W

Saturday
June the 29
Commences with a fresh breeze from W steering E by S
fine pleasant weather one watch employed in Ships duty
middle part much the same latter part a strong breeze
from west very squally and rainy at 8 o'clock took in fore
and mizzen top gallant sail and flying gib
Obs Lat 41.06 Long 58.36 W

Sunday
June the 30
Commences with a fresh breeze from W steering E by S very squally
and rainy at 4 p.m. took in the main top gallant sail at 6 p.m.
blowing on double reefed the top sails middle part more
moderate at 3 o'clock shook the reef out of the top sails and set
the main top gallant sail latter part light variable winds and rainy

Monday
July the 1
Commences with light variable winds from the northward and
westward and very rainy middle part light winds from
S^E steering E^SE with all sail set latter part the wind
hauled to E ship heading S^E one watch employed in Ships duty
Obs Lat 40.40 S Long 52.22 W

Tuesday
July the 2
Commences with a breeze from E ship heading S^E all sail
set at 6 p.m. breeze on took in the fore and mizzen top gallant sails
and flying gib at 8 p.m. squally and rainy took in the main
top gallant sail and double reefed the top sails at 2 o'clock
more moderate shook the reefs out of the top sails at daylight made
all sail the wind shifted to west steering E^SE so ends
Obs Lat 39.58 N Long 49.58 W
