Journal kept on Board Ship H. W. Morgan
commencing June the 9th 1846

Monday June the 9th commenced with fresh breeze
at 6 AM weighed anchor for sea with
light breeze from W. at noon of the
same day & made so much - - - -

Tuesday the 10th com. with light breeze from
S.W. at 2 PM discharged the Pilot boat
steering S.E. at $\frac{1}{4}$ past 5 the Moon came
out of sight the latter part rainy weather
& wind variable & made short sail so much

Lat 40° 40' 00" N.
Long by Obs.

Wed the 11. these 24 hours com with fresh
breeze from N.W. steering S.E. and employed
firing the boat & to fetch the latter part saw
slack tide and employed about ship duty and
so forth - - Lat by Obs 38° 48' N. Long 68° 20' W.

Thurs June 12th these 24 hours com with fine breeze
from S.C. and the latter part equally variable
and made short sail wind S.E. by S. variable
Lat - - Long - -

Fri June 13. these 24 hours com with strong
gales from S.S.W. steering E. by S. made double
dub. Jib & saw a ship steering S. of the
latter part fine with wind from W. and steering
E. by S. Lat 38° 51' N. Long 61° 30' W.

Sat June the 14 these 24 hours com with fine variable
but light airs from W. and steering E. S. E. the
middle & latter part much the same

Lat 38° 30' N. Long 61° 45' W.

Sun June the 15 these 24 hours com with light
breeze from W. middle fresh breeze from N.W.
to the latter part the same Lat 37° 00' N.
Long 61° 45' W.
