Remarks on Board C. W. Morgan

of New Bedford C. F. Keith Master Pacific

Wednesday July 13th

This day commenced with fresh breeze from S.W. and the Bark C. W. Morgan left New Bedford on the voyage to South Pacific ocean we left at about 9 A.M. and the weather became thick very foggy. Tug Boat left us about 1 P.M. we made sails and steered S.W. at Sun down took in Light Sails and chose watches and Boats Crews.

Thursday July 14th

First part of this day thick weather and fresh Breeze Bark steering S.W. but in latter part clear wind hauled to E. we head bow S. Lat. 39-30

Friday July 15th

Calm all this day and smooth all hands employed in fecting Riggins and other things. Saw plenty porpoises and lower for the

Saturday July 16th

Light breeze from E. and smooth in the first part of the day in the latter part the same all hands employed in fecting ship and lash our cutting penments getting ready for whales saw number ship heaving E. and we saw one steamer

Sunday July 17th

Strong breeze from S.W. first part of the day in the latter part rainy & Bark steering S.W. and by E. took in light sails and double for top sail

Monday July 18th

Strong wind from S.W. squally and rain we steered S.W. and we took in all sails but close reef main top sail in latter part moderate steered S.W. with main top gallant sail
