Remarks on Board Barque C. W. Morgan of New

Monday June 14th

Light breeze from E.N.E. in the first of the day middle part fresh breeze and rainy the Barque steering N. we have try works over board in the latter part the wind hauled to S.E. and quiet strong at 4 P.M. we saw school small whales we lower 3 boats and got one took him long side & we steered N.N.E. Lat. 39-00 Long. 70-26 W.

Tuesday June 15th

Fresh breeze from S.E. in the first part of the day we cut in little whale in the latter part the wind hauled to E.N.E. the Barque steered N. at 8 P.M. got bottom 45 fathoms of water Lat. 40-05 Long. 70-48

Wednesday June 16th

This day commences with thick fog and light E.N.E. the Barque steering N. course in the latter part light up we land and many vessels but we did not get in dried out Calm we sounded bottom 20 fathoms

Thursday June 17th

This begins with fresh breeze from S.W. and quiet foggy the close to land at 10 A.M. got Pilot and steered in but became fog again and come to anchor at 12 M. at 7 P.M. we got under way and come in sight of the black point come to anchor again

Friday June 18th

This day begins with fine weather and pleasant we took up anchor and got tug and went to the wharf this ends our voyage on Board C. W. Morgan 592 1/2 months 1500 Barrels
