

Remarks Monday <sup>March 21</sup> 1852  
Commenced at noon with light  
variable winds and cloudy weather  
with showers of rain

At 10 a breeze spring up from the N.W.  
squared the yards

At 10 the wind hauled to the Southward  
braced the yards up on the Starboard side  
concludes with cloudy weather no observation  
this day. Tuesday March 22 1852

Light winds and cloudy weather  
employed cleaning the rest of the iron work

At 10 Variable winds hauled <sup>to the</sup>  
accordingly

Employed fitting runs, coals round  
the pumps and other necessary work

Concludes with a steady light breeze  
from the Southward making 6 knots
