

Whale voyage Capt. Charles
1

Thursday August 6 1846

Get underway at 6 a.m. and
put to sea in Co with the *Beyers Mary*
Sip. Mr. Hanson's crew and Hollander discharged the
pilot and visitors at noon the wind from
the westward rather light but increasing
as we draw out to sea

Friday August 7 1846

Begins with fine but foggy
weather and light breeze from westward
steering S. by E. and haul anchors and called by us to
fit boat oil and be shore watches and boat crew
at 5 P.M. remain land here at 4 to distant
10 miles

Middle part fine but hazy with
light breeze from S. by E.

Last part fine but cloudy with
light breeze saw a number of sails all hands
employed manuever mast heads

Saturday August 8 1846

and with fine but foggy weather
and light breeze from S. by E. saw a
number of sails all hands employed

Middle part fine weather with
some fog and light breeze from S. by E.

and light breeze with fog and haul watch
employed in pumps. Duty saw a sail
