Wednesday, March 14<sup>th</sup> / 60

part calm saw a Brig standing  
to Eastward Lat 29-12 North Long  
67-06 West Go ends these 24 hours

Thursday, March 15<sup>th</sup>  
first part calm Mid and  
latter part light Winds from  
Northward all sail out on the Wind  
Heading N.W. Lat 29-26 Long  
67-06 West Go ends these 24 hours

Friday, March 16<sup>th</sup>  
Comes in With light Winds from  
N.E. & W. and good weather  
all sail out Heading N.W.  
Saw a Spanish Steamer steering  
East. Mid. and latter part  
Winds from N.E. Course N.W.  
Lat 30-15 Long 68-38 W  
Go ends the 24 hours

Saturday, March 17<sup>th</sup>  
Comes in With Moderate  
Breezes from N.E. and fine  
Weather Mid Wind E.S.E. all  
Sail out latter part Much  
the same Course N.W. Lat  
32-40 Long 70-20 West Saw  
General vessels steering to Southward  
Go ends these 24 hours

Sunday, March 18<sup>th</sup>  
Comes in With fresh Breezes from  
S.E. and Clouds all sail out  
the same latter part fresh breeze  
Carrying N.E. Lat N.W. Lat by  
Lat 34-50 N Long by this 71-23 West  
Go ends these 24 hours

Monday, March 19<sup>th</sup>  
Comes in With fresh Breezes from  
S.E. steering N.W. & at N.W. Lat  
Winds from S.E. and equally  
Mid fresh breeze latter part very  
light Winds from East Course N.E.  
Lat 37-30 Long 72-40 West  
Go ends this day
