Friday April 2d

Fresh breeze call sail set middle part
agale from the SE steering N.W. by N latter part
blowings strong & very heavy squalls with rain
middle close reefed topsails and fore sail standing
N winds the same Lat 33.17 N Long 68.46 W

Saturday April 3d

Blowing heavy from the SE under close reef
topsails middle part moderate all rest set standing
N.W. by N latter part moderate from the SW all
sail set & bearing N.W. by W and under way
Lat 34.33 N Long 70.09 W

Sunday April 4th

Commenced with a light breeze from the West
all sail set middle part moderate a light
breeze blowing from the N.W. saw three ships
latter part light breeze from the N.W. and
under way Lat 35.17 N Long 71.52 W

Monday April 5th

Commenced with a calm breeze middle part
moderate toppling wind light breeze with
with wind N.W. latter part light breeze from the N.W.
saw three sail standing SE employed at scraping
Lat 35.17 N Long 71.52 W

Tuesday April 6th

Commenced with a moderate breeze from the
Westward steering N.W. by N at 10 P.M. the wind
suddenly to the N ship on either tack with
a strong breeze under double reefed topsails
standing West by North Lat 37.03 N Long 70.09 W

Wednesday April 7th

Commenced with a strong breeze from the SE
under double reefed topsails middle part and latter part
blowing gale ship hoisted the Westward tack
latter part saw three ships standing SE
Lat 37.03 N Long 70.09 W

Thursday April 8th

Begins of wind with toppling jibs and
middle part from the N ship on either tack several sails in
sight variously employed ending with toppling
tack heading N.W. by N. Lat 35.15 N Long 36.44 W

Friday April 9th

Commenced with a strong breeze from the SE
steering N.W. by N middle part and latter part the
same steering N.W. by N variously employed
two sails, jibs, Lat 37.38 N Long 70.47 W

Saturday April 10th

Commenced with a pleasant weather from the
W.N.W. steering N.W. by N at 10 P.M. made the land through
Island wind gradually hauling to the Northward
employed hauling up & bending the cables &
getting the anchors off the bow several sails in
sight ending with wind N.W. by the wind
latter part heading N.E. Montague light in sight
in between a strong breeze Lat 40.34 N Long 71.51 W
