

Remarks On Board Ship Clifford Wayne

Thursday 25<sup>th</sup> March 1841

At daylight hove short and took the anchor on the Bow made all sail with light air from the S.W. standing out at 9 dropped the anchor under foot again at 10 took the anchor and stood out to sea for the first time since sailing from the ...

Friday 26<sup>th</sup> March

Breeze freshened stood over top the Bay and lashed ship and pitched out the the mast passage at sundown pilot left and N.W. hazy to the South at 11 O'clock passed 1 mile to the West of Romans Land at 12 O'clock it bore North 4 miles latter part wind from the South being S.E.

Salt by Obs 41.48  
Long by Obs 49.01 West

Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> March

First part of these 24 hours strong winds from South being S.E. watch employed on duty middle part winds hauled N.W. course S.E. took in Top Sails latter part took in Main Sail and set M.S. Sail

Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> March 1841

First part of these 24 hours unbeat Main Course and repaired it beat it again wind falling off 1 Bk in sight middle and latter part near calm and cloudy saw Blackfish near ...

Monday 29<sup>th</sup> March

First part of these 24 hours calm caught a sunfish, with a little of rain middle part calm at 2 O'clock wind hauled up from the North and hauled to the East blowing to the South with a good breeze watch employed at Ship Duty

Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> March

First part of these 24 hours lashed ship to the S.E. wind S.E. strong breeze hauled in Top & Mizzen S.S. Sails middle part took in M.S. Sail and Souled up Top Sails blowing a gale from the S.W. latter part blowed by Top Sails course S.E. with a heavy sea and plenty rain
