

Ship Clifford Wayne On a Whaling Voyage. Coast of Rowland Is.
Remarks On Board Tuesday 22nd Oct 1844

At 9 A.M. Pilot came aboard took our anchor and stood out of the bay with the wind east, all sail out, at 10 discharged the Pilot at 11 A.M. cutter hauled light bore N.E. by E 1/2 East Distant 15 miles steering S.W. employed 21 flogging anchors and spars &c &c

Remarks On Board Wednesday 23rd Oct 1844

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from the east steering south at 1 P.M. took in the Top & Sails. Thick cloudy weather several men sick at 11 o'clock. Comand Land Bore N.E. by E Distant 10 miles at 6 P.M. Doubled Reefed the Top Sails course S.E. & Middle strong breezes from N.E. by E latter part no alterations watch employed at the top 1000

Remarks On Board Thursday Oct 24th 1844

First part of these 24 hours strong breezes from N.E. under Doubled Reefed Top Sails, course S.E. at 4 o'clock Reeped Fore & Mizzen Top Sails Middle part no alteration in the weather at 10 o'clock fresh gales and heavy wind & S.E. at noon light up got the suns altitude

Latt by Obs 37° 41' North

Remarks On Board Friday Oct 25th 1844

First part of these 24 hours fresh gales from the east under cloud Reeped Top Sails by the wind to the S.E. this day close boats crew Middle & latter part no alterations in the weather employed 17 coiling lines and filling Boatswain

Latt by Obs 36° 38' North

Remarks On Board Saturday Oct 26th 1844

First part of these 24 hours more moderate got the Main Sail wind east at 5 P.M. took in Main Sail heading S.E. Middle more moderate set the Sails spanken more ship to the N.E. at 3 A.M. more ship to the S.E. wind & N.E. latter part fresh gales, under close Reeped Top Sails with the wind E

Latt by Obs 34° 24' North

Remarks On Board Sunday Oct 27th

First part of these 24 hours wind S.E. more ship to the N.E. and N.E. by E with a Gale under close Reeped Top Sails & Fore Course at 6 P.M. more ship to the S.E. by S and took in Fore & Mizzen Top Sails and Fore Sail Middle part a Gale from the east, latter more moderate at 7 A.M. set the Top Sails and jibs & spankers and more ship to the N.E. wind S.E.

Remarks On Board Monday Oct 28th

First part of these 24 hours fresh Sails from the S. by W under Doubled Reefed Top Sails and Courses Course E by S at 10 took in Main Sail latter part wind South and blowing a Gale Sisk in Sails & Fore & Mizzen Top Sails and close Reeped the Main with heavy squalls and plenty of Rain to end this 24 hours
