winds from the N^W heading to the N^E

Latter part Light winds from the South heading
to the E^{SE} imployed making out for
provisions Lat 36.3 Long 69.50

Friday May 29th commenced with light
breezes from the S^{SE} heading to the E
imployed steaming hold Middle part the
same Latter part Wind from the S^E and rain
sent the cutting pennants a left Lat 36.5

Saturday May 30th commenced with light winds
from the S^E Starboard tack a board
raining 1 sail in sight Middle and Latter
part the same Lat 37.34 Long 66.53

Sunday May 31st commenced with light
winds from the S heading to the E^{SE} tried
the boats 2 sail in sight Middle part the
same Latter part Light winds from the
S^W steering to the E^{SE} Lat 37.05 Long 65.38

Monday June 1st commenced with light winds
from the S^W heading to the E^{SE}
Middle and Latter part the same so ends
Lat 36.25 Long 63.22

Tuesday June 2nd commenced with calm
weather and a heavy swell on fittings rigging
se Middle part the same Latter part light
winds from S^W steering to E^{SE}
so ends Lat 35.41 Long 61.54

Wednesday June 3rd commenced with light winds from
the S^W steering to the E^{SE} Middle part
light winds from the S^E heading to the
S^W at 10th Latter part the same

Thursday June 4th commenced with strong breezes
from the S^{SE} heading to the N^E raining and
a heavy swell on Middle and Latter part the same
Lat 35.15 so ends these 24 hours

Friday June 5th commenced with strong breezes
from the S steering E by S raining and a
heavy sea on Middle and Latter part the same
Spoke a ship from N York. did not know her name
Lat 36.11 Long 58 by Lunar

Saturday June 6th commenced with strong breezes
from the S steering E by S pleasant weather
Middle part the same Latter part wind from the
S^E steering to the Eastward Lat 36.28 Long 5.

Sunday June 7th commenced with light winds
from the S^E steering from E by N to E by S
Middle and Latter part the same saw a
part of a rack sent the boat 10 fish Lat 36.30

Monday June 8th commenced with light winds from
the S^E heading to the Eastward Middle part
the same Latter part saw Blackfish sawed
the boats struck 2 the W boat 1 the
L boat took them to the ship and hit
them in Lat 36.14 Long 54.14 by Lunar

Tuesday June 9th commenced with light breezes
from the S^{SW} heading to the E^{SE} nothing
in sight Middle part the same Latter part
light winds from W^{SW} and raining
Lat 35.44 Long 49.57
