 All day ship working to the N & NW
 with all sail out P and light breeze
 from the S.E. - Nothing in sight
 ship working to the NW water blue
 and clear all day but nothing in it
 Lat at Merid 35 35
 Long by Chron 67 42

Thursday May 22nd 1873
 All day light breezes from the S.E. and
 overcast - ship steering NW with all
 sail out - no signs of whales - water
 quite blue and clear - Two sail
 in sight steering to the S.E.
 Lat 36.40
 Long 69.16

Friday May 23rd 1873
 All day light breezes from the E &
 S.E. and overcast with light spitting
 of rain - ship steering to the NW
 in the morn then hauled up A. with
 all sail out - saw through the day
 two schools of Blackfish and two
 schools of porpoises all going to wind-
 ward quick - no other signs of whales
 at 4 P.M. set topmast stud sail
 and started for New Bedford direct
 One sail in sight steering to the
 S.E.
