

Remarks on Board the Barque Cora. 1841.

15. Thursday Sept 17th 1841. Commenced with Pleasant breeze from the Westward steering S. E. by E. hands employ^d in ship's duty. Middle part light wind from the Westward latter part moderate breeze from N. W. & S. W. lowered the boats for blackfish without success to end
 Noon Lat^d 39 57 N Long 43 19 W

16. Friday Sept 18th Commenced with moderate breeze from N. W. & S. W. wind hauling to the N. E. saw a break run for it saw nothing more fish & 6 fish strong breeze from E. N. E. to E heading S. E. took in top gallant sails and double reef^d the topsails Middle part strong breeze from the E. took in the mainsail and top daylight moderate to the mainsail and top latter part strong breeze heading S. E.
 Noon Lat^d 38 47 N Long 43 56 W

17. Saturday Sept 18th Commenced with strong breeze from E. N. E. heading S. & S. W. tacked to the N. E. employ^d in ship's duty. latter part the same daylight turned the reefs out of the topsails moderate breeze from S. E. heading E. N. E. employ^d boiling the black fish blubbery to end
 Noon Lat^d 39 27 N Long 42 56 W

18. Sunday Sept 19th Commenced with moderate breeze from S. E. heading E. N. E. & 2 p.m. finish boiling made about 2 p. bls. Middle part the same. latter part light wind from the S. & steering E. S. E. the sail in ship hands at leisure found all well
 Noon Lat^d 40 25 N Long 42 18 W

19. Monday Sept 20th 1841. Commenced with light breeze from S. W. steering E. S. E. & 2 p.m. saw blackfish lowered the boat. succeeded in taking one 5 fish in sight. Middle part strong breeze from E. S. W. took in top gallant sails and top sails steering E. S. E. daylight set the maintop gallant sail 3 sails in sight 2 steering to the E. one ship tacking to the N. W. so was with 2 men sick and fine breeze from N. W. steering E. S. E.
 Noon Lat^d 40 15 N Long 39 33 W

20. Tuesday Sept 21st Commenced with fine breeze from the Westward steering S. E. by E. & 2 p.m. passed 2 ships steering to the N. & 4 p.m. spoke the Charles W. Morgan 14 days from Bedford for the Pacific Capt. Antons hands employ^d in ship's duty. Middle part strong breeze from N. W. steering S. E. by E. with passing rain squalls latter part the same saw a brig steering to the S. E. so was with 2 men sick.
 Noon Lat^d 39 52 N Long 36 50 W

21. Wednesday Sept 22nd Commenced with moderate breeze from E. N. E. with fog squalls steering by the wind to S. E. employ^d boiling the blackfish blubbery & 5 p.m. passed a ship headed to the North by the wind. Middle part strong breeze from E. to E. S. E. heading by the wind from S. E. to S. E. latter part the same took in the maintop gallant sail employ^d in ship's duty.
 Noon Lat^d 38 44 N Long 36 23 W
