and pleasant steering N.W. by N. Middle and Latter parts
the same Noon Lat^o 29.20 N Long 60.49 W. 3 p.m.

Monday March 31st Commenced with Strong breeze and
pleasant steering N.W. by N. Middle and Latter parts Moderate
sea arising, steering to the N. Solent -
Noon Lat^o 29.48 N Long 60.10 W

Tuesday April 1st Commenced with Fresh breeze
at N.E. Middle and Latter parts the same saw 3 Sails
steering to the N.E. Noon Lat^o 32.12 N Long 63.13 W

Wednesday April 2nd Commenced with Strong breeze at
N.W. steering N.W. by N. Middle and Latter parts the same
steering N.W. with rain - Noon Lat^o 34.07 N Long 65.25 W

Thursday April 3rd Commenced with Moderate breeze & S.W.
with hailing rain squalls, steering N.W. at 5 p.m. saw a School
of Whales going to the N.W. past a brig steering to the
E.N.E. Middle parts wind & weather heading S.W. Latter
parts the same - Noon Lat^o 35.45 N Long 66.10 W

Friday April 4th Commenced with Light breeze at N and plea-
sant S.W. heading to the West sun at 11.00 N.W. heading
to the N.W. Latter parts the same Latter part sun hauling to the N.W.
with a heavy N.W. gale, steering N.W. by N.
Noon Lat^o 35.31 N Long 69.43 W

Saturday April 5th Commenced with Strong gale at N.W. took
in the 2 fore topsails & 1 hall double reef the 2 topsails Main
jib and the Main sail fore top sail fore sail and close reef the chain
top sail heavy rain with thick thunder and vivid lightning
Noon Lat^o 37.10 N Long 68.47 W

Sunday April 6th Commenced with Light breeze at N.E. to N.W.
heading by return to N.W. Middle part Fresh breeze S.W. and
blowing Latter part head hauling to N.E. and increasing to a heavy
gale took in all sail to close reef Main top sail blowing strong
with rain - Noon Lat^o 38.10 N

Monday April 7th Commenced with strong gale at N.E. with
rain heading to the N.W. sun at 11.00 moderating with a heavy swell
from N.E. Midnight set double reef Top sails & fore sail wind E & E
Latter part calm. Noon 38.48 N Long 70.10 West

Tuesday April 8th Commenced with Light breeze S.W. steering
N.W. Middle part calm Latter part Strong gale at N.W. saw
a large ship steering to the Eastward. Noon Lat^o 39.45 N Long 69.56 W

Wednesday April 9th Commenced with Strong gale from N.W. &
with heavy hail squalls took in all sail to a close reef Main
top sail a Barque under the lee laying to under close reef Main
top sail Middle and Latter parts the same saw a Barque steering
to the Eastward to wind Noon Lat^o 39.56 N Long 69.02 W

Thursday April 10th Commenced with Strong gale
& N.W. heading from N.W. N.W. by N. Moderate moderating
Midnight made sail Latter part Strong breeze at N.W.
steering N.W. Noon Lat^o 40.50 N Long 69.30 W

Friday April 11th Commenced with Strong breeze at N.W.
hazy at 2 p.m. past the Fishing Pipe about 27 Miles West
& 4 p.m. hounded in 50 fathoms water sunset wind hauling
to the N.W. Middle part light breeze at N.W. 2 Sails in sight
and a great many Right Whales. Latter part Moderate
breeze N.W. spoke the brig H. W. Tyler of New York
34 Miles N.W. of S.S.E. of Cape Cod. several Whales
in sight and Right Whales. Noon Lat^o 41.55 N Long 69.45 W
from the 20 Miles to the West
