

Remarks <sup>of</sup> the Crew Board Ship Constitution 300

From 1866 Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> Come with fair wind from the N N W at 9 A M all hands came on board and made all sail and went to sea with 32 Men and women Ladys all told at 11 A M the Pilot left steering S by E with fine weather

2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> Come with light wind from the N E steering S E by S at 3 P M all hands and chose watches at 3 P M some saw some Land bearing N E distant 8 Leagues stood Middle part at 7 P M set the watch the way in starboard watch on deck light wind the ship and calms and Pleasant weather Latter part the same all hands employed in fitting for whaling

3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> Come with light wind from the N steering S E by E and pleasant all hands employed in fitting for whaling and settling their accounts with Captain at 7 P M hauled some of the light sails Middle and Latter part fine wind from the N W steering S E by E all hands employed in fitting the Boats Lat 39:37 Long 68:20 W

4<sup>th</sup> Friday 9<sup>th</sup> Come with fine wind from N W steering S E by E and pleasant all a sail in hands employed in fitting Boat saw some sight sail Middle part light wind from the N W steering S E Latter part light wind mixed and calms from the westward at 9 A M a empty pass a cask over the Starboard Boat and back went to it but found it empty the Bk. in sight a steam of ice the watch employed in fitting for Whaling Lat 39:03 N Long 68:05 W
