

Remarks on board Barque Cornelia A. D.  
Commencing the Voyage - May 1st. 1860

Thursday - May 1st. 1860

At 10 A.M. took the Anchor and stood  
into the Bay with fresh breezes from  
the N.

Wednesday - May 2<sup>d</sup>

First part fresh breezes  
from the N. at 5 P.M. discharged the  
Pilot. Middle light variable winds  
and Calms with thick rainy weather  
Latter thick weather wind from the  
Eastward

Thursday - May 3<sup>d</sup>

Mostly heavy gales  
from the N. ship scudding under  
two close reefed Topsails

Friday - May 4

Mostly strong winds from  
N. to N.W.  
Sahly 64-37-50  
Long 71-54  
Lat 30-14 N  
70-32 W

Saturday - May 5<sup>th</sup>

Fresh breezes and rainy  
Lat 34-36 E  
Long 71-00 W

Sunday - May 6<sup>th</sup>

First part fresh breezes  
from N.W. saw one Limbeck Middle  
and latter strong breezes from the  
Westward  
Lat 34-14 N  
Long 71-15 W

Monday - May 7<sup>th</sup>

First part fresh breezes from  
the N. Middle light and rainy latter  
same
