Tuesday Nov 3rd 1863 Remarks on board
This day commences with wind from the N^W
pleasant weather part of the crew on board
Ship laying in the stream pilot on board
wind blowing fresh from S^W had to let go
The stahard anchor at 12 o'clock all hands on
Board so ends this day Satt Long

Wednesday Nov 4th 1863
Remarks on board his day commences with
Strong wind from the S^W at midnight
Wind hoked to W at 5 A^M called
All hands to take the anchor and mad
Sail at 6 A^M got undar way with
Strong wind at 9 pilot left went on
board the lute boat lashed the anchors
Stowed the chains kee of S^SE at sail
So ends this day Satt 41.02 A^M Long

Remarks on board Thursday Nov 5th 1863
First part of this 24 hours light wind from
S^W middle part wind W latter part
Wind S^W fres breeze all sail set
Cours E by S Employed in fitting the
Boats Corling tounlins 4 New Beorls steam
Lins saw two sails heading in to the
W^NW so ends this 24 hours
Satt 39.26 A^M Long

Remarks on board Friday Nov 6th 1863
First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze from
The S^W Cours E by S all sail set
At 6 P^M wind hoked to W took in
Top gablets sails double reefed the top sails
had rain squalls later part all sail set
So ends this day Satt 40 A^M Long
