

Ship Cornelius Howland of New Bedford

Remarks on board Saturday Nov 7<sup>th</sup> 1863  
This 24 hours commences with strong wind from  
NW with rain squalls at 7 P M wind fresh  
NW with heavy squalls at 6 took in top  
galeen sails at 9 P M double reefed the  
top sails ship rolling heavily lost the  
West Boat and hours sun craft  
Later part more moderate made all sail  
Cours E by S Lat 40.55 N Long 72.08 W

Remarks on board Sunday Nov 8<sup>th</sup> 1863  
First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze from  
NW carrying all sail middle and later part  
light air from N Cours E by S E S  
So ends this 24 hours  
Lat 40.51 N Long 72.02 W

Remarks on board Monday Nov 9<sup>th</sup> 1863  
First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze from  
SSE steering by the wind heading to  
the E at 6 P M squally took in the top galeen  
sails at 8 double reefed the top sails  
Later part fresh gale from S heading ESE  
Imploil in seeing up rigging saw one sail  
So ends this day Lat 40.50 N Long 72.29 W


Remarks on board Tuesday Nov 10<sup>th</sup> 1863  
First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze from  
S heading ESE middle part more  
moderate all sail later part blowing  
Wedge double reefed the top sails  
steering by the wind so ends this day  
Lat 40.39 N Long

Remarks on board Wednesday Nov 11<sup>th</sup> 1863  
First part of this 24 hours "gale from the S  
Later part the same blowing heavy large sea  
Raining heading ESE so ends this day  
Lat 40.55 N Long 72.08 W

Remarks on board Thursday Nov 12<sup>th</sup> 1863  
This 24 hours commences with gale from the  
S heading ESE carrying double reefed top  
middle part cleared the top sails large sea on  
So ends this day Lat 41.00 N Long 72.07 W

Remarks on board Friday Nov 13<sup>th</sup> 1863  
First part of this 24 hours fresh breeze  
from the W carrying all sail at 8 P M  
squally took in top galeen sails at midnight  
took them again Cours SE at 6 P M saw  
4 bark to the seaward steering to the SE  
at 8 P M raised a gam of sperm whales  
at 10 P M toward 3 boats Subard quarter  
Boat struck and killed him took him  
long side cut him in so ends this day  
Lat 40.15 N Long 39.20 W

Remarks on board Saturday Nov 14<sup>th</sup> 1863

First part of this 24 hours light wind with  
large sea on imploil in cutting at 8 P M  
wind from W Cours SE later part  
strong wind with rain squalls imploil in  
braking out for the trigs clearing away  
the head breaking out water for calks  
So ends this day Lat Long
