 saw several small sail

 and fine weather - saw several fine
 birds and several gulls the watch
 employed in ships duty

 at 5 AM saw plenty of fine birds
 at 8 AM saw blackbirds several
 gulls and killed two at 10 AM
 took them to the ship and
 histed them in as ever this day

Commenced with pleasant breezes
 employed in cleaning blackfish
 at 8 PM saw black fish
 several but could not get past our
 plenty of fine birds and several
 sail at 9 AM took in the fore
 and main top gallant sails

Middle part the same

Latter part pleasant breezes
 the watch employed in ships
 duty as ever this day
