Remarks on Board Wednesday April 11th
all this 24 hours light baffling winds with thick
and foggy weather the scho with storm sails set

No observations this day
Remarks on Board Thursday 12th
this 24 hours commences with light winds from eastward with
thick weather at 4 pm the wind hauled to North blowing
light breeze steering S W at midnight hove to under
storm sails heading E N E at daylight steering N S W
with fine weather made all sail past a brig steering
to eastward mastheads man saw nothing

Lat 36 = 19 North
Long 74 = 51 West

Remarks on Board Friday 13th
this 24 hours commences light southerly winds and pleasant
weather at 4 pm wind hauled to westward course east
latter part the same ship under all sail at 9 am
saw blackfish lowered the boats got one struck three
more and lost them

Lat 36 = 25 North

Remarks on Board Saturday 14th
first of this 24 hours light wind from westward weather
pleasant steering S by W at 6 pm wind hauled to
N E a moderate breeze at 9 am reef mainmast
and took in flying jill ends with blowing strong breeze
with pleasant weather from S W

Lat 34 = 55 North
Long 73 = 47 West

Remarks on Board Sunday 15th
this 24 hours commences with strong breeze at 10 AM with
heavy sea the scho under reef sails by wind steering
S E at midnight wind hauled to N E with rain latter
part moderate weather clear ship under short sail
course south

Long 72 = 56 West

Remarks on Board Monday April 16th
the first of this 24 hours moderate breeze from eastward with
fine weather course S at sunset took in sail for the night
through the night light winds at sunrise made all sail
the scho by wind heading S S W all hands employed in
ships duty saw nothing to day

Lat 32 = 31 North
Long 73 = 11 West

Remarks on Board Tuesday 17th
all this 24 hours light southerly winds scho by wind heading
S W at sunset took in sail at midnight wore ship heading
S E at daylight made all sail all hands employed in ships
duty saw nothing to day so ends the day

Lat at noon 32 = 6 North
Long 73 = 18 West

Remarks on Board Wednesday 18th
all this 24 hours light southerly winds with fine pleasant weather
the scho by wind heading N S W with all sail set at 10 pm
took ship heading in to S S E all hands employed in ships
duty mastheads man saw nothing to day

Lat 31 = 24 North
Long 73 = 9 West

Remarks on Board Thursday 19th
first part of this 24 hours light winds from westward with pleasant
weather at 9 am wind hauled to N E with rain took in sail
at daylight made sail with pleasant weather and moderate
breeze course S W saw nothing this day

Lat 30 = 43 North
Long 74 = 16 West

Remarks on Board Friday 20th
all this 24 hours light easterly winds with pleasant weather
scho by wind heading to southward with all sail out saw numerous
sails to westward

Lat 30 = 14 North
Long 74 = 57 West
