Brig Daisy Log Book

Beginning May 13. 1908, Wednesday
at 9.30 AM the Jessie Wherman took us
the Brig in tow for sea. They let go of the Brig
at 11.30 eleven thirty just outside the
Hend Chickens wind the most light at sunset
passed the Round Pig light ship. ship bound
on a whaling & elephant voyage. at 2.30 PM
wind light haled clear around to the north
and east so at 4 four the wind got out to east
to furl the light sails, allow bus stowing
the cables & anchors at dark stands land
14 miles distance bearing N.E. by N. ship heading S by E
sharp by the wind. with the lower bit well weather
good. 21 men all told on board. " " " " " " " "

Thursday
This day begins with
south east wind at 8.30 the wind haled
to the East and heaved on fresh so furling
the fore top gale sail and reefed the
main sail mid all the part the same
ship on the port tack by the wind
Lea 40 35 at beam 40 35 of mast

Friday 14th
Today we
begins with moderate winds from
the East ship on the port tack at 9 AM
we see a tramp steamer steering to the
west North West ship heading S by South
the men riged out the cutting stage
latter part wind light with rain
no observations, barometer standing
on 31.09 tenth
