

Sept 21, 1921

Thurs 1 This day find us engage boiling
wind light from the west after
breakfast made some sail with on
the port tack heading N. by N. with
at one PM began to crew the work
down latter part began to be
squally lat 51.44 Lon 159.24 W

Friday 2 Today begins with moderate
weather wind from the west down
on the port tack heading N. by N.
latter part squally wind variable
N. by N. " " "

Sat 3rd Sept. This day begins with variable
winds from S. West to west down
the port tack spoke a steamer and
got his longitudinal lat 31.59 Long 160.55

Sunday 4 This day begins with fine weather
down on the port tack heading N. West
with all sail set at one o'clock
raised a large sperm whale toward
the starboard boat after a short while
the starboard boat went alongside
the whale was black skin the boats
two men pole his down at the whale
and just picked the whale so missed
the fish so away went the whale
lat 32.18 Long 161.22 W

Sept 5, 1921

Monday 5 Today begins with moderate winds
from the West down on the port tack head-
ing N. by N. by N. we see a schooner & spoke
for a Canadian named the Newell
Capt Garhardt. loaded with fish & lumber
bound to Port Rico lat 32.40 Long 162.14 W

Tues 6 This day begins with fine weather down
steering N. by N. with light S. West wind
at 2.30 PM raised a school of sperm
whales going into the N. East lowered
the starboard boat & chased on after the whale
the starboard boat struck and saved
a small whale took him alongside
and cut him inboard got him all
inboard at eight o'clock. so on the
day lat 33.08 Long 163.23 West

Wed 7 Today begins & ends with fine
weather wind from the S. West ship
boiling and steering off to the N. West
at 8 PM man cooled the work down
having finished boiling the whale
lat 33.05 Lon 164.34 West

Thurs 8

Today begins with strong S. West winds
also very squally with heavy rain
at 1.30 PM furled the main sail and set
the D. sail at 4.30 kept the fore sail
down steering N. by N. West lat no
