

Sept 4th, 1921

Thurs 4 This day find us engage boiling  
w/ in light from the west after  
breakfast maid some sail when  
the port tack heading N by E  
at one P.M began to cool the water  
down latter part began to be  
Squally Lat 31.44 N. Long 69.24 Wn

Fri 5 This day begins with moderate  
weather wind from the west when  
on the port tack heading N by E  
latter part Squally wind variable  
Lat 31.44 N. Long 69.24 Wn

Sat 6 Sept. 6 This day begins with variable  
winds from S. West to west when  
the port tack spoke a steamer and  
got his longitude Lat 31.89 Long 60.33

Sunday 7 This day begins with fair weather  
when on the port tack heading West  
with all sail set at one o'clock  
X received a large spermaceti whale lowered  
the other boats after a short while  
the starboard boat went alongside  
the whale was black skin the boats  
then took pole his turn at the whale  
and first pricked the whale so massive  
the fish go away went the whale  
Lat 32.18 Long 61.22 Wn

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Monday 8<sup>o</sup> day begins with moderate winds  
from the west when on the port tack heading  
N. by E. see over steamer spoke  
per a Canadian named the Russells  
Capt Garhardt loaded with fish & salmon  
bound to Port Rico Lat 32.42 N. Long 62.14 Wn

Tuesday This day begins with fair weather when  
steering N. by E with light West winds  
at 2:30 P.M. raised a school of sperm  
whales going into the East-colored  
water three boats chased on after the whale  
X boat the starboard boat struck and scared  
a small whale took him alongside  
and on the starboard got him all  
intured at eight o'clock. No wind the  
day start 3.30 Seong 63.33 West

Wednesday 9<sup>o</sup> day begins ends with fair  
weather wind from the West ship  
boiling and steering off to the N. West  
at 8:30 A.M. cooled the water down  
having finished boiling the whale  
Lat 32.05 N. Long 64.34 West

Thursday

To day begins with strong West winds  
also very Squally with heavy rain  
at 1:30 P.M. pulled the main sail and set  
the fly sail at 4:30 kept the fore sail  
the steering N. by W. Lat 32.05
