 At 5. D.M. took the anchor went to sea fresh breezes from the N.W. at 6 feet & discharged the pilot, the light boat off the son & pigs bearing & distance one mile steering S.W. Middle part of N. letter part S.E. all hands employed in stowing the anchors chaming & fitting the boats, saw black fish in order. double reefed the top sails a number of seals in sight. Lat. by obs. 39. 49. N Long. by obs. 70. 45. W
 Charles A. Robby Deserted
 May 22nd / 1851 at New Bedford

Sunday May the 25th / 51
 Begins with fresh breezes from the N. steering S.E. made sail Middle & letter part moderate breezes from the S. heading S.W. set all sail, three sail in sight, steering to the Westward, Gulf wind plenty, so ends.

Monday, May the 26th / 51
 Begins with fresh breezes from S.W. heading S.E. & D.M. took in the light sails saw several seals steering to the S.W. Middle & letter part light breezes & variable N.W. hands employed in ships duty fitting boats boiling lines &c.

 Long. by obs. 69. 35

Tuesday, 9 May 27th / 51
 Begins with light breezes from S.W. heading S.E. by the wind Middle part the same letter part light breezes from the N.W. steering to two sail in sight, all hands employed in ships duty fitting boats stowing water & getting by rigging. Lat. 38. 30. N Long. 69. 10. W
