Ship standing in the S. West and

Chains kept mid Parts by the  
Latter Parts good breeze & steering  
S. E. by South employed rigging  
the Boats, several sails in sight  
Lat 40-53 N  
Long 70-34 W

Off Boat on Whales

Wednes day, Aug 7 - 1875  
This day land wind weather strong  
breeze from S. W. steering S. E. by S  
emp getting the Boats ready mid  
Parts fine weather Latter Parts  
Latter Parts at 7 a.m. rose Spirit  
Whales toward three Boats steered  
to the 4th Boat killed him the  
other two Boats still in chase  
Lat 38-52 N  
Long 68-18 W

Thursday Aug 8 - 1875  
This day fine weather took the  
Whale along side the two Boats came  
on board got beach and cut him in  
finished at seven P.M. mid Parts  
emp cutting up the Whale on deck  
two Sails in sight Lat Parts strong  
breeze steering S. E. half South got  
Ready and started the Boats  
two Sails in sight Lat 37-43 N  
Long 68-40 W
