Saturday Feb 2nd 1867

Fresh breeze from the eastward and pleasant steering by the wind to S.E. under short sail watch employed in various duties Lat 28.00 North

Sunday Feb 3rd 1867

All this day strong breeze from the eastward and rugged steering by the wind to S.E. Lat 26.45 Long 47.50

Monday 4th 1867

First and Middle part a strong breeze from N.E. and squally with rain steering E. by S. under short sail latter part of day wind from S.E. continues fresh and squally with lightning steering by the wind the watch employed in various duties. No Observations

Tuesday 5th 1867

Buffings from the Southward and Eastward. by the wind on opposite tacks under easy sail the watch employed in ships duties

Lat 25.10 N. Long 46.07 W.

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Thursday 7th 1867

Wind light baffling and from the Eastward and Pleasant steering by the wind to the Southward under easy sail watch employed in ships duties Three seamen of duty Lat 23.11 W.

Friday Feb 8th 1867

Light breeze from the Eastward and pleasant steering by the wind to the S.E. all sail set the watch employed in various ships duties Thomas Gardner came to duty. A Whiting O. Hall and Joler A. sick of duty Lat 24.14 N.

Saturday 9th 1867

First Part of this day squally with rain steering to the S.E. at 7 o'clock A.M. the wind wind settled into the N.E. and blew fresh which we call the N.E. trades winds steering S.E. A Whiting Char O. Hall Joler A. of duty saw one sail and pinbacks Lat 23.11 N

Sunday 10th 1867

Strong breeze and squally with rain steering steering by the wind to S.E. under easy sail saw a Bark steering to the Westward carried away the Starboard head rail wore ship and picked it up A Whiting Charles O. Hall Jones and Joler sick of duty No Observations
