

Nov 28 still laying at anchor at augustine with fine weather and head wind

Nov 29 still at anchor fine weather and head wind this day went on shore and got some oysters

Nov 30 laying at anchor with fine weather and head wind

Dec 1st at 4 P.M. the pilot came on board took our anchor and beat down the river at 10 crossed the bar and the pilot left and we hauled on the wind bound to cape canaveral with head wind

Dec 3d came to anchor at cape canaveral and landed our oil and came on board

Dec 4 at 6 P.M. went on shore and took our oil to the light which is one mile from the landing some we rooked and some we took up in a cart with a mule and of all places for musketoes this is the best that is ever seen at twelve came on board and took our anchor bound for cape florida

Dec 6 this day supplied cape florida light with about 600 gallons of oil and 40 tubs galles at 3 P.M. came on board and it being light winds and so strong current ahead let go our anchor and lay until 5 in the morning of the 7 at 5 P.M. took our anchor and made sail for key west

Dec 8th at 1 P.M. hauled along side of the wharf at key west at 3 landed our oil and took it up to the light with horses landed about 500 gallons

Sunday Dec 9 laying at key west fine weather so ends

Dec 10 laying at key west fore part rainy imployed breaking out and filling oil latter part fine left one man sick at the hospital and shipped another

## South Coast of Florida

at 6 P.M. hauled out into the stream we ends  
Dec 11 at 5 P.M. took our anchor and made sail for the tortugas islands at 7 P.M. came to anchor one mile from garden key light with strong winds from E

Dec 12 at 6 P.M. took our anchor and run into the harbour and let go our anchor at 10 supplied the light with about 600 gallons of oil latter imployed breaking out and filling oil these 24 hours blowing a gale from the N.E. so ends the 24 hours

Dec laying at garden key with high wind from eastward and squally imployed at ship's duty

Dec 14th at 6 P.M. took our anchor and made sail bound to castor key a small island at the extreme of tampe bay harbor key light contains 14 lamps and is a fixed light so ends Dec 14 with fine weather

Dec Sunday 16th at 8 P.M. let go our anchor at the island of castor key these 24 fine weather

Dec 17 at 4 P.M. supplied the light with about 500 gallons of oil and 130 tubs galles this light contains 18 lamps and is a fixed light at 10 returned and got under weigh bound to st marks at 2 P.M. owing to strong current and light winds were obliged to turn back and come to anchor again at 5 P.M. went on shore and got some coffee off of and all sack which was lost in 1835 at 6 returned with 112 lbs of coffee so ends the 24 laying at castor key and fine weather
