

Remarks on board Barque Elizabeth
of Freeport B. W. Winslow Master bound on
a whaling voyage in the Indian Ocean and
Greenland

Thursday Nov 11th 1841

This day commences with fine breezes from
N. N. W. and fine weather. At one P. M. Pilot
came on board; at 12 past one weighed anchor
and found the Barque agrounds at 12 past 2
got her off and steered from the Narrows
to Bull River; at 6 o'clock let go our anchor
at Bull River and sent a boat on shore. At 11
o'clock A. M. took our anchor and proceeding
towards New Port with a fine breeze from S. W.
and fine weather.

Friday Nov 12th 1841

This day commences with moderate winds from
N. N. W. and good weather; at 1 o'clock P. M. let
go our anchor at New Port and sent our
boat on shore and discharged the Pilot. At 10
A. M. took our anchor but it became quite calm
and we let it go again, all hands employed in
getting the ship ready for sea

Saturday Nov 13th 1841

This day commences with light winds from S. E.
and heavy rains at 1 o'clock P. M. took our anchor
and stood out to sea; but the weather becoming
thick and the wind increasing we were obliged
to run back to New Port, and let go our anchor
which was at 12 past 4 o'clock P. M. and at 5 P. M.
wind suddenly shifted to N. W. and blew heavy
which obliged us to let go our second anchor;
at 7 o'clock A. M. took our anchor and beat
out of the harbour with a fine breeze from
N. E. W. after getting clear of the harbour we
steered to sea
