

Tuesday July the 29<sup>th</sup> 1845  
Commences with light gales from the S S E  
and the Bark heading to the E N E  
and one sail in sight steering to the N W  
and a great number of finbacks in sight middle  
part strong winds from the S S E and the Bark steer-  
ing to the S W latter part strong winds from the  
S S E and the bark heading to the E S E with one  
sail in sight steering to the Eastward  
lat by observation 17° 25' South longitude 2"

Wednesday July the 30<sup>th</sup> 1845  
Commences with strong winds from the S S E  
and the Bark heading to the S W at 2 A.M.  
Saw the Annawan standing to the E N E  
at 5 A.M. wore ship to the East at sunset  
shortened sail for the night at daylight made all  
sight at 2 P.M. saw a humpback a finning  
lat by observation 17° South longitude by  
Chro 2° west

Thursday July the 31<sup>st</sup> 1845  
Commenced with strong winds from the S S E and the  
Bark steering to the E N E with nothing more in sight  
than one humpback  
at sunset tacked ship to the S W and carried  
sail all night the Bark heading S W latter part  
employed in making an oil boat and got down  
in sight to the S W lat 17° 35' South long 2° 40'

Friday August the 1<sup>st</sup> 1845 5  
Commences with pleasant weather at 2 P.M.  
Spoke the *Diophylus* Chase of Westport  
Car Ball 9 months out 220 lbs of sperm oil  
lost one man by a whale at sunset shortened  
sail for the night at 7 P.M. started at daylight  
made all sail and stood to the S W with two  
sails in sight at 10 A.M. tacked ship to the  
Eastward latitude by observation 17° 15' South  
lon by Car = 2° 17' west

Saturday August the 2<sup>nd</sup> 1845  
Commences with pleasant weather standing to the  
S W under all sail at 6 P.M. shortened sail for the  
night middle part wore ship to the East latter part  
strong winds from the S E and the Bark heading  
S W lat by obs 17° 40' South long by Chro 2° 15'

Sunday August the 3<sup>rd</sup> in the year 1845  
Commences with strong winds from the S S E and the Bark  
heading to the S West at sunset wore ship to the East  
middle and latter part the same with 2 sails in sight sup-  
posed to be whalers latitude by obs = 17° 36' lon 2° 30'

Monday August the 4<sup>th</sup> 1845 Commences with strong  
winds from the S S E and the Bark heading S W with  
2 sails in sight middle part strong winds from the S S E and  
sails in sight latter part the same latitude by obs 17° 35' lon 2° 30'
