

Bark Elizabeth and A. Whaling Voyage in 1845  
Monday August the 11<sup>th</sup> 1845

Commenced with strong winds from the ESE and equally the Bark heading to the SW under double reef topsails & courses. Middle part strong wind and thick weather the Bark heading to the SW latter part the same saw two sails both of which were steering to the NW Latitude by obs 17°45' South Long west

Tuesday August the 12<sup>th</sup>

Strong trades and thick weather Commenced with the Bark heading to the SEW at 6 P.M. tacked ship to the Eastward saw 2 or three finbacks latter part more moderate latter part the same saw 2 sails and 2 or 3 finbacks Latitude by observation 17°28' west

Wednesday August 13<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with strong winds from the SE and the Bark heading to the Eastward saw several finbacks in P.M. hump back at sunset shortened sail for the night middle part moderate latter part strong winds from the SE and cloudy the Bark heading to the Eastward at 8 A.M. sent down the fore top gallant yard

Thursday August 14<sup>th</sup>

Commenced with strong winds and thick weather the Bark heading E by N with a number of finbacks in sight at 2 A.M. tacked ship to the SEW latter part moderate latitude 16-31 Long E or west

Remarks on Board August the 15<sup>th</sup> 1845

these 24 hours Commence with light winds from the southward and the Bark heading to the SW at 2 A.M. tacked ship to the Eastward at sunset luffed to the wind and shortened sail for the night Middle part light winds and the Bark heading to the Eastward at 3 P.M. tacked ship to the SW at sunset shortened sail for the night latter part wore ship to the NW saw one sail supposed to be a whalman Latitude by observation 17°05' Long 2°57'

Remarks on Board Saturday August 16<sup>th</sup> 1845

these 24 hours Commence with a light wind from the southward and the Bark heading to the Westward at 2 P.M. saw a sail to the E & saw a sail off the weather bow then tacked ship to the Eastward at 6 P.M. shortened sail for the night Middle part wore ship to the SW latter part moderate So ends these 24 hours Latitude by observation 17°05' Long 2°57'

Remarks on Board Sunday August the 17<sup>th</sup> 1845

these 24 hours Commence with light winds from the southward and the Bark heading to the westward saw 2 sails of the weather one supposed to be a whalman the other a merchantman at 7 P.M. tacked ship to the SW day light pleasant weather the Bark heading to the SW at 10 A.M. saw a brig to the SE or boiling called it the Anna  
Latitude by observation 17°38' Long 3°07'
