

Rain and took in Steering. Steaming Sails and royals and topgallant sails and double reefed the fore and Mizzen topsail and blowing strong from the E. by N. and thick cloudy ob. at 10 PM took in the Mizzen sail and blowing strongly from the E. S. E. and rain & squalls & clouds part much the same as before ob. at 5 AM more more reefed out & set topgallant Sails & Steaming Sails and the watch employed in working off Tacks ob. at half past 7 PM the watch cleared and employed in working off Tacks and thick cloudy weather ob. and latter part of these 24 hours ends with a strong gale from the E. S. E. and rain Ob. this Day but by date reckoning we are in Lat 22° 15' North Dico. Long 59° 33'. East Long ob. ob.

Monday March 29th these 24 hours commences with a gale of wind from the E. S. E. & thick Squally ob. raining at 2 PM took in the fore and Mizzen topsail and blowing a strong gale of wind & rain and a large sea on ob. at 6 PM more moonlit and set the foretopsail ob. at 10 PM set the Mizzen topsail ob. reefs out and main topgallant sail ob. at 12 at knight fresh breeze from the E. S. E. and thick weather ob. at half past 7 PM the watch cleared and blowing and raining strong from the East and clouds these 24 with strong squalls and raining constantly and taking sail and make sail and so on these 24 hours and no Ob. this Day but by date reckoning we are in Lat 22° 45' North Dico. East Long in 60.50. West ob.

Tuesday March 30th these 24 hours commences with St. moonlit. Gale of wind & rain from the E. by N. ob. at 4 PM more moonlit and wind from the E. S. E. ob. and out low Steaming Sail ob. ob. at 6 PM carried a very thick foretopsail Steaming Sail however split the fore topgallant sail and blowing strong from the E. by S. and rain ob. and middlepart blowing strong from the East and flying clouds ob. at half past 7 PM the watch cleared and employed in repairing the foretopgallant sail and strong winds from the E. by S. & clear weather ob. and latter part of these 24 hours with moonlight from the E.

And left in by Ob. 27.28.29.30. Long 59° 24' and
Wednesday March 30th there is now commences with wind from the E. S. E. and pleasant weather and all hands steering Sails. Breaking out the foretopsail ob. and moonlight work and winds light from the S. and east ob. at 10 ob. & ob. and middlepart light winds from the S. E. by S. ob. at half past 7 PM the watch cleared and employed in Ships Duty and light winds from the S. E. by S. and latter part the seas winds & pleasant weather and moonlight ob. Sett in by Ob. 28.29.30. North East Long in 60.15. West ob. ob.

Thursday March 30th these 24 hours commences with winds from the South ob. & light breeze and pleasant weather now the watch employed in Ships Duty ob. at 1 PM the watch cleared & all set employed in working hole ob. & light air & wind from the West ob. and middlepart the same kind of weather ob. at 2 AM a large from the N. N. E. and thick weather ob. at 2 PM a strong breeze from the N. E. and thick weather & finding the topgallant Sails ob. fly yet at half past 7 ob. the watch cleared and employed in Ships Duty and the winds more moonlit ob. set topgallant Sails ob. and latter part of these 24 hours ends with a fresh breeze from the N. E. ob. And left in by Ob. 29.30. North East Long in 60.50. West ob.

Friday March 26th these 24 hours commences with fresh breeze from the N. E. by E. & course N. ob. and the watch employed in Ships Duty ob. at 6 PM winds from the East ob. and all set ob. and middlepart strong winds from the S. E. and flying clouds ob. at half past 7 PM the watch cleared & employed in Ships Duty and all ob. ob. & winds from the South ob. course N. ob. ob. at 11 PM blowing stronger & finding the fore and main topgallant sails out and back down the fore & main royals ob. ob. at 12 PM took in Steaming Sails and back these 24 hours ob. Sett in by Ob. 26.27.28.29.30. North East Long in 60.50. West ob.
