

Rainy and took in Steering, Steering Sails and royals
and topgallant sails and Double reefed the fore and Mizzen top sail
and blowing strong from the E. by N. and thick cloudy
at 10 Pm took in the Mizzen sail and blowing strong
from the E. S. E. and raining & squally & a moderate
part much the same as before & at 5 Pm. more men
sent and reefs out & set topgallant Sails & Steering Sails
and the watch employed in washing off Decks & at half
past 7 Pm the watch landed and employed in washing
off Decks and thick cloudy weather & at latter part of
these 24 hours Ends with a strong gale from the E. S. E. and rain
Oh this Day but by tide reckoning we are in Lat 22.15
North Long 59.33. East Long 81.81.

Monday March 29th these 24 hours Commenced With
a Gale of wind from the E. S. E. & thick squally & raining at
10 Pm took in the fore and Mizzen top sail and blowing a strong
gale of wind & rain and a range sea on & at 6 Pm more
men sent and set the fore top sail & at 10 Pm set
the Mizzen top sail & reefs out and main topgallant sail
& at 12 at night fresh breeze from the E. S. E. and
thick weather & at half past 7 Pm the watch landed
and blowing and raining strong from the East and squalls
these 24 with strong squalls and raining constantly and
take in sail and make sail and sound these 24 hours
and no Oh this Day but by tide reckoning we are in
Lat 24.15 North Long 58.50. East 81.81.

Tuesday March 30th these 24 hours Commenced with
a moderate Gale of wind & rain from the E. by N.
& at 4 Pm more men sent and wind from the E. S. E. &
and out here Steering Sail & at 10 Pm carried away
the fore topmast Steering Sail & split the fore
topgallant sail and blowing strong from the E by S. and
some rain & at middle part blowing strong from the
East and flying clouds & at half past 7 Pm the watch
landed and employed in reefing the fore topgallant sail and
strong winds from the E by S. & Clear weather & at latter
part of these 24 hours wind more moderate from the E. E.

and took in by Oh 27.22 North Long 59.22
Wednesday March 31st these 24 hours Commenced With men
sent from the E. S. E. and pleasant weather and all hands
employed in washing Sails & breaking out the fore top & at
10 Pm took in the fore top & at middle part light winds from the
E. by S. & at half past 7 Pm the watch landed and employed
in Ships Duty and light winds from the E. by S. &
at latter part the fore wind & pleasant weather and sound
these 24 hours & set in by Oh 28.40 North
East Long 58.15 West 81.81.

Thursday March 31st these 24 hours Commenced
with winds from South & a light breeze and pleasant
weather and the watch employed in Ships Duty & at
10 Pm the watch landed & all hands employed in washing both
of light air wind from the West & at middle part
the fore wind of weather & at 2 Pm a breeze from
the N. N. E. and thick weather & at 4 Pm a strong
breeze from the N. E. and thick weather & finished
the topgallant sails & fly & at half past 7 Pm
the watch landed and employed in Ships Duty and the
winds more moderate & set topgallant Sails & at latter
part of these 24 hours Ends with a fresh breeze from
the N. E. by E. and set in by Oh 29.22 North
East Long 58.50 West 81.81.

Friday March 26th these 24 hours Commenced With
fresh breeze from the N. E. by E. & course N. 78 and the
watch employed in Ships Duty & at 6 Pm winds from
the East & at 10 Pm and middle part strong winds
from the S. E. and flying clouds & at half past 7
Pm the watch landed & employed in Ships Duty and all hands
of light winds from the South & course N. 78 &
at 10 Pm blowing stronger & finished the fore and main
topgallant sails and about 10 Pm the fore & main royals gone
& at 11 Pm took in Steering Sails and sound these 24 hours
& set in by Oh 27 North and Long 57.10 West 81.81.
