Remarks on Board Sunday July 15th
First part. Light winds from the N. S. W. all hands
Employing in Working the Ship out of Buzzards Bay
at 5 pm. we Discharged our Pilot in the Mouth of the
Sound at 5 P.M. the S. E. Head of Noman's Land Bore.
E. N. E. 5 Leagues from which I take my Departure. From
it lying in the Latth 41. 15. N. Long 70. 49. W. S. E.

Middle part fine Breeze and pleasant Weather. With all Sails
West the head Bore.

Latter part. Much the same all hands
Employing in unboarding the Sails and Slings them in. Between
decks we saw two Seal Skinning to the Southward and westward.

Remarks on Board Monday 17th 1830

This 24 continues with a fine Breeze and pleasant weather all hands
Employ in Ship Duty all sail is sight.

Middle part. With the same.

Latter part. continues about the same, all Hands Employing
in fitting the Boats for whaling, and to work upon the
Whaling we saw some Porpoises, and Blackfish, so
Ends these 24 Hours.

Remarks on Board Tuesday 20th 1830

This 24 hours continues with a Steady Breeze from the N. S. E.
Head with the Wind is hauling Round to Northward, all hands
Employing in Ship's duty.
