

Remarks on Board Friday February 11th 1831

This 24 hours commences with a fine Breeze and pleasant weather the wind to the S. N. E. the Ship Steering to the N. W. 1/2 W. at 2 p. M. we set the Main top Gallant Studding Sail at 5 p. M. the wind started back to the N. E. and we took in the Royals and Studding Sails and flying jills at 6 p. M. we saw a Seal a head!

Middle part Strong wind and Squally at 5 p. M. we passed by the same Subarus throughout Latter part the wind and weather much the same we saw some porpoises 30 Cooks. Latth 15.24 North Long 50.45 West

Remarks on Board Saturday February 12th 1831

This 24 hours commences the same the wind to the N. E. the Ship Steering to the N. W. 1/2 N. Employed in Making and taking in Sail we saw a plenty of Gulf weald

Middle part very Strong wind and Squally took in the Main top Gallant Sail and Longs keep the fore and Mizzen top Sails

Latter part Employed in Making and taking in Sail fore and main some very heavy Squalls with Light Rain we saw too
