Remarks on board W. Mosher Ship Emerald
Wednesday May 29th 1833

These twenty four hours begin with pleasant gales from S.W.
At 2 o'clock weighed our anchor and sailed from the harbor
of New Bedford at 8 A.M. left our pilot All hands
Employed in ship duty so ends these 24 hours

Here it has a space of 19 Days for which time I shall give no
Account of
May 29th

Remarks on board June 15th 1833 W.B. Mosher
These 24 hours begin with westerly winds at 9 A.M. lowered
and went on shore at Flores one of the Western Islands Ship
Good Return. Millwood and Jane of Nantucket arrived at
the same time We purchased hogs, fowls, vegetables &c

Remarks on board Wednesday June 19th 1833
These 24 hours begin with strong breezes from E. N. E.
Middle and latter part the same All hands employed in
Ship duty so ends these 24 hours

Remarks on board Sunday June 23rd 1833
These 24 hours begin with strong easterly winds saw Ship
Good Return to Windward at 4 P.M. she ran down
and spoke us Capt. Howland came on board so goes these
twenty four hours

Remarks on board Monday June 24th 1833
These 24 hours begin with south easterly winds Middle and
latter part the same the Island of Foyal and Pico in sight
