

Saturday 28th ~~April~~ 1835 All those 24 hours  
Strong breezes and clear weather at Day.  
Light made the Island of St Helena 1 point  
Off our lee Bow at 12 o'clock came to anchor  
Off the harbour of

Wednesday Mar 4th 1835 All those 24 hours calm and  
Clear weather at 10 AM sailed from the harbour  
Of St Helena in co with ship Susarora of New London  
So ends those 24 hours

Thursday 5th

Friday 20 March 1835 Those 24 hours begin  
with squalls of rain and moderate breezes  
Middle and latter part the same this day  
We crossed the Equinoctial line so ends  
those 24 hours

Sunday 23 March 1835 Those 24 hours Strong  
Breezes from N.W. & under fine weather  
So ends

Wednesday 1 April 1835 those 24 hours light  
Breezes and clear weather at 2 P.M. spoke  
Ship Ann Maria of New London with  
1300 Barrells whale and 600 Barrells sperm  
Oil 23 Months out

Saturday 11 April Strong breezes and cloudy at  
4 P.M. spoke Brig Union of Portland for Board  
To Trinidad de Cuba with Lumber and Molasses  
Hogsheads - Long 67.08 West

Sunday 12 April 1835 those 24 hours begin with  
Heavy gales of wind at 7 A.M. doubled reefed  
Our top sails wind N.E. by E. Course N.E. by N.  
Saw the Briggs standing South Lat 31.09 N  
Long 69.54 W

Monday 13 April 1835 All those 24 hours calm and  
Clear at 11 AM. Lowered our boats for Blackfish  
Could not fasten 1 Brig off our Beam Standing N.W.  
Lat 32.29 N

Tuesday 14 April 1835 First part this 24 hours light  
Breezes and from N.W. middle part Strong breeze  
S.W. Course N latter part wind shifted to N Gale with  
Rain so ends Lat 34.3 N

Wednesday 15 April 1835 First part this 24 hours strong  
Breezes N.W. latter part strong breezes from S.W.  
Course second S so ends

Thursday 16th April 1835 First part this 24 hours calm  
Latter part latter part tremendous Gales of wind  
From S.W. in the gulf strewn with rain thunder  
And Lightning

Friday 17th 1835 those 24 hours heavy gales from N.W.  
At 11 A.M. shifted a sea which carried away our gang  
Way Board Bullworker &c so ends this 24 hours

Saturday 18th April 1835 Those 24 hours heavy gales  
from N.W. lay to in the gulf at 2 P.M. saw the  
Barge Commerce of Portland Lat 37.53 N

Sunday 19th 1835 All those 24 hours light breezes and  
Clear S.W. latter part strong breezes at 12 P.M. carried  
away our flying Lib Broom still in the Gulf

Monday 20th April 1835 All those 24 hours Strong  
Southerly breezes and foggy at 6 P.M. Sounded  
in 45 fath water at 7 hove to so ends those 24  
hours
