

Remarks on Board Bark Endeavour

Monday June 30th

Came with fine weather and light breeze ship standing off and on shore at 6^o Am sent 2 Boats off at 7^o Am
Came to Anchor at 1^o Pm the Starboard and waist Boats
Came on Board with out Success, 5 Ships in sight 3 of
them Boiling at 9^o Pm the Starboard and Bow Boats
Came on Board with out Success so ends this Day

Tuesday July 1st

Came with fine weather. Ship at Anchor. Called
all Hands at 1^o Am and sent 4 Boats off in shore
for whales 6 Ships in sight 4 of them Boiling the Boats
Came on Board at 7^o Pm with out Success they saw
some whales. Plenty of ice in sight they got some
fresh fish of the Natives on shore so ends this Day

Wednesday July 2nd

Came with fine weather and the ship at Anchor called all
Hands at 2^o Am and sent 3 Boats off for whales at 7^o Am
the Captain went off. 7 Ships in sight 5 of them Boiling
all the Boats Came on Board at noon with out Success
the Captain brought off a Boat load of wood at 1^o Pm
took the Anchor and stood a Croast the Gulf saw
some few whales at 11^o Pm stood in the Gulf

Thursday July 3rd

Came with fine weather Ship standing off and on shore
Called all Hands at 5^o Am and sent 3 Boats off and
at 9^o Am Captain went on Board the Port King fisher
she got 6 whales. at 10^o Am Came to Anchor at noon
the Boats Came on Board with out Success and we took
our Anchor at 3^o Pm sent 3 Boats off in the ice with
out Success saw the King fisher take a whale ship
standing off and on shore so ends this Day

Friday July 4th

Came with fine weather Ship standing off and on shore
Called all Hands at 3^o Am and lowered 4 Boats for whales
with out Success saw the Ship Thomas Age take a
whale in the ice Boats Came on Board at 2^o Pm

Monday July 5th

Came with thick weather at different times ship standing
off and on the ice. Called all Hands at 5^o Am and sent
3 Boats off in the ice for whales. at 8^o Am the Captain went
off in the ice and struck an hole but the iron did not
go in and missed with the second iron. all the Boats Came
on Board at 7^o Pm with out Success, number of Ships in sight

Tuesday July 6th

Came with thick fog ship standing off and on the ice
Called all Hands at 5^o Am and sent 2 Boats off in the ice
at noon ship running through the ice the Boats Came on
Board at 2^o Pm with out Success at 3^o Pm fine clear
weather spoke the Bark Midas of New Bedford
with 4 whales, at Anchor. 3 or 4 Ships in sight at 10^o Pm fog

Wednesday July 7th

Came with foggy weather ship standing off and on the
ice called all Hands at 5^o Am at 5^o Pm smelt a head
whale or Carcar to windward and we lowered the waist
in search of it with out Success plenty of ice in sight

Thursday July 8th

Came with thick weather and light air and calm ship
standing off and on the ice. Called all Hands at 6^o Am
and sent 2 Boats the Starboard and Bow Boats off in the ice
fired for four Day. in the afternoon lighted up a little
saw a Carcar at 5^o Pm thick fog

Friday July 9th

Came and ends with a thick fog and brisk breeze from
N.W. ship by the wind standing off and on the ice

Saturday July 10th

Came and ends with thick fog and Brisk with strong
breeze from N.W. ship by the wind standing off and
on the ice. Gannetted with the Ship Thomas Age with 600
barrels of oil. Starboard and Bow Boats off so ends this

Sunday July 11th

Came with thick fog and light breeze ship standing off and
on shore we fired the Cannon for the Boats with out Success
at noon lighted up so that we should see top of the Land over
the fog. and 3 Ships in sight spoke the Midas thick fog
