

Dec 17th 1857

Remarks Wednesday 17  
Light winds from E & Course  
S.W. one watch employed in Ship's  
deck hauling new fence last  
notes sent out flag in long  
flag sent up mail voy all for it

My Lat to day is 25.50 South  
My Long to day 27.55 West

I have had rather long passage here  
but still live in hope to quit a long passage  
I look forward to the time when I can  
say that I am doing well and have done  
well the ship does not prove all to  
gether as well as I anticipated but still  
think she will do nicely

Ship enters port on the 20th Nov  
bound to Cape Horn 226 Long  
gained at the Sandwich Islands March 28.  
Left the Islands April 17th

Friday 19th Light breeze from  
E and Calms with main course  
S.S. 4th watch out steering  
one watch employed in  
Ship's deck Lat 25.10 Long 29.33

All this middle part very heavy  
rained Later the weather better

Latitude 25.7  
Long 28.30

Liverpool bound South 20th

Remarks Saturday 20th 1857  
W. wind from N.E. with squalls of  
rain baribles one watch employed  
employed in making repair to gullent mast  
at 6 P.M. finished it

Mixed fine weather at 7 AM saw sperm  
whales at 9 AM at 10 B. Baker struck bill  
at noon took him to the ship  
to land

Remarks Sunday 21st  
Winds E.S.E. Ship lying by anchor at  
1 P.M. commence cutting at 3 finished cutting  
then went ship made all sail all hands employed  
in cutting up tubs at 5 P.M. all cleared  
up Light house from E course & W by E

Middle part steering S.S. 7th  
watching

Remarks Tuesday 23rd  
Light breeze from E course W  
steering for Pernambuco hailed  
out the whale he made us 12, 13  
hauling him at all

Lat 7.55 Long 33.25

Remarks Wednesday 24th Light breeze  
from E course W at daylight made  
Pernambuco Light saw the land  
plains at 9 AM close in I went on  
shore for the purpose of buying 1 lb. mace  
but got none
