be and sweep us to home from  
there to be successful in taking oil  
to Yulek amount that we may see  
happy are we and then speed home  
off way to that happy land  
and comfort dwell there to  
be together in stoves of perpetual  
No Obs for Day "

Remarks Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> 11  
have had for the last 2 days  
from S.S.E which has run  
distance to the N.W. this day strong  
winds from S thick with  
Calms N.W. at 4 PM the wind  
spring suddenly to the N.W. thick with  
rain and all must Calms  
I think I shall get a fair wind  
that is a wish from the N.W. so I can  
lay my course

Remarks Monday 9<sup>th</sup> of May 1853  
thick & foggy with raised light  
from N.W. sharp up on Stock

Remarks Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> 1853  
This Day Strong Winds from N.W.  
with squalls of rain. There had  
for the last 3 Days moderate  
gales from N.W. with  
with squalls of rain the weather  
changing from soft warm to cold  
and rather uncomfortable this  
Even the weather is mild clear  
moderate at 10 o'clock  
Reading N.W.

Thursday 15<sup>th</sup>  
have had thick weather for  
the last week with snow and  
hale winds from N the west  
part of the time this day steady  
with ground thick with  
snow at 7 o'clock  
at 10 o'clock being with squalls
