First part

a calm at 12 m^o. saw an immense shoal of fish Albion lowest & best and about 4 very large ones the American in company the Capt. on hand at 3 P.M. a fine fore-leeve breeze springing up from S.W. steered N.E. bent the cables ran 2 m. forth pilot boat - Middlesex and after strong breeze from

S.W. and pleasant steering N.E. S.E. N.E. and E.S.E.
at 3 A.M. made Montauk point & so far as I know at 8 A.M.
we took a pilot and run in the bay at 11 o'clock we
proceeded near central wharf and at 12 m^o. went on Shore

Having made the voyage in 33 hours and 16 days
